The resulting collaborative management, and greater focus on learner-centered and self-exploration learning, will allow for greater competitiveness and increased visibility in the education market.



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Training Modules are designed as gateways to the use of Web 2.0 tools in education

Each Module includes materials sourced from the Internet as examples of the educational resources available online

The modules assume no practical experience of the use of Web 2.0 tools

The purpose of the training workshop is to introduce you to the modules and receive evaluative feedback

Two additional modules will be available by autumn 2011. By then, all modules will also be translated into Italian, Spanish, German and Dutch.

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Workshop Agenda

1. 30 minute group discussion about our current experience of Web 2.0 and views about its use in education.
2. 60 minute practical group exercise to examine the delivery platform, its functionality and navigation, and also to view the module content and structure. A single module session will be selected for brief evaluation.
3. 30 minute round table discussion about blended and distance learning, about the use of web 2.0 tools in delivery, and about appropriate pedagogic approaches.
4. 60 minute practical group exercise to evaluate a second module session; this time in more detail and completing all the learning activities. Evaluation questionnaire to be completed as part of the exercise.
5. Final round table discussion and arrangements for online phase of the evaluation. Organisation of webinar.
